
BUCK MOUNTAIN


The lovely sight of the mountains and boats makes for an excellent hike.

PROSPECT MOUNTAIN

Elevation: 1650 ft. • Map E-4 Round Trip: 4 mi., Time: 3 Hrs. Directions: In Lake George Village, turn west from Route 9 onto Montcalm St. and proceed 5 blocks to Cooper St., turning right one block to West St., and then left one block to Smith St. where you turn left again. Up a short distance is an elevated walkway that crosses over the Northway. Great for picnics. A splendid panoramic view.

Lac du Saint Sacrement

Lake George Steamboat Company

The newest addition to the Lake George Steamboat Company's fleet of excursion vessels is a modern dinner-dance showboat with the character and grace of 19th Century steamers. Designed as a 3/4 scale replica of the 2800 passenger steamer S.S. Peter Stuyvesant, the

Lac du Saint Sacrement is 190' in length with a beam of 40' and can accommodate 1000 passengers for sightseeing, cocktails and hors d' oeuvres and 350 for dinner and shows. The name Lac du Saint Sacrement in English is translated "The Lake of the Blessed Sacrement" given to our lake by the Jesuit Priest, Father Isaac Joques, who first came upon the lake on the eve of the Feast of Corpus Christi in 1642. Naming the lake in honor of the holy celebration, the lake retained its original French name until 1756 when the English won the French and Indian War and renamed the lake in honor of the king, George III, thereby

calling it Lake George. The Lac du Saint Sacrement is built of all steel and to U.S. Coast Guard and American Bureau of Shipping Standards. She is propelled by caterpillar diesels, has all modern rescue boats, life jackets for every passenger, an



emergency generator, and dual operating capability for its safety systems. No combustible furnishings are on board. It boasts four passenger decks, three of which are air-conditioned and heated. The vessel has a full galley, three cocktail lounges, a dance floor, snack counter, and a gift shop. The upper two decks are open for lounge chairs. There is a wheel chair lift between her first, second and third decks. Her single stack that measures 20' high and 7' across accentuates her stately appearance. The Lac du Saint Sacrement will certainly help carry on the company's 200 year tradition of fine vessels

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BIKES FOR ADULTS, TEENS AND CHILDREN

Welcome to Warren County and the Lake George Region where we have miles and miles of scenic roadways to explore and a wonderful bike trail on which to take a relaxing trip!

So what are your options? Well first, the Warren County Bike Trail runs along the old rail line from the south end of Lake George down to Queensbury (where it crosses Quaker Road over a large bridge). From the village to Queensbury is approximately 8 miles on a paved, rolling bike path. Most of the trail is a dedicated bike route but the last 1.5 miles consists of a dedicated bike lane along the county The bike trail is largely

what you choose to make it. Serious cyclists can ride this trail for training as easily as someone looking for a casual ride can enjoy it for a leisurely afternoon ride. It is hilly (you are in the Adirondack Mountains right?) but it is very rare that someone cannot manage to cycle their way around on it. And after all, you are on vacation, so if you have to get off and walk your bike up the hill near the Magic Forest, then what is the big deal? You are still out in the fresh air of which the Lake George Region has an abundance! A trip down and back on the bike trail from Lake George typically takes 2-3 hours for most families, but can be done in as little as an hour by a motivated cy-

Once you reach the Queensbury terminus, the trail connects into the Glens Falls City Trails and the Feeder Dam Trail System which

provides many more miles of riding for the serious cyclist. So our local trails will give everyone from plenty of exercise and enjoyment during your visit. children to competitive racers

There are also many wonderful roadways where longer rides will take the serious cyclist through forests and along lakes with wonderful views. Riding up, near and around Brant, Loon and Schroon Lakes in northern Warren County will provide both beautiful views and plenty of vertical gain for those who enjoy day long treks. A visit to Rick's Bike Shop or Inside Edge (both in Queensbury) can provide the competitive rider with the information they need to plan a challenging day of training.

And a final thought...please wear a helmet while riding. Just because you are on vacation doesn't make your head any harder or the

pavement any softer. Given that we only get one brain per lifetime, please treat yours with the respect that it deserves ©

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



Prospect Mountain is one of Lake George Region's iconic landmarks. This beautiful mountain, located in the foothills of the Adirondacks, has a 2030 foot summit with magnificent panoramic views of Lake George & the Adirondacks. It is very popular among tourists, locals, and hikers because of its 100 mile view at the peak!



Drive up to the summit on the Veteran's Memorial Highway, built and dedicated in 1969 in honor of America's War Veterans. Along this very enjoyable 5.5 mile ride, stop at three breathtaking overlook areas: 1. The Narrows, 2. Lake George Panorama, 3. The Eagle's Eye. At the Summit, park your car and ride the Prospect Shuttle (an open air view-mobile during the summer season and an enclosed van during cooler months) to the peak for a spectacular panorama of Lake George and the region. Picnic facilities and restrooms are also available on the summit, as well as self-guided hiking & nature trails which are well marked. Discover the historical ruins including the Bullwheel and the Old Cable Railway. See the remains of what was once the world's largest cable railroad from 1895-1903. This Cable Railway brought passengers for an overnight stay at the Prospect Mountain House, a hotel once located at the summit.



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

PARASAILING

By Patrice McMahon Parasailing Adventures

What does Lake George look like from above? Visitors who have been parasailing know! Aloft in a parachute 300' in the air, attached with a rope to a speeding boat, parasailers have a bird's-eye view of the lake and surrounding area.

While pondering a new way to instruct fledgling skydivers, Pierre Lamoigne couldn't have known that he was making aviation sport history when in the early 1960's he attached a parachute to his moving car and invented parasailing. In the 1970's parasailing moved to the water, at first launching and landing the participants from the shore, and then from specially designed "winch boats." These winch boats, made specifically for parasailing, are used nearly everywhere in the United States.

Parasailing has been a popular Lake George activity for many years, using a method that was somewhat unique to the lake. Traditionally, parasailers were taken to a floating raft and pulled from the raft by a speed boat. The longstanding Lake George method then landed the passenger back onto the raft.

After having been in the parasailling business for twenty-five years, Parasailing Adventures began offering a modern ocean-style parasailing on the Lake for the first time five years ago. On any given day, their winch boats can be seen flying visitors two by two and three at a time side by side in a larger, brightly colored parachute. Up to ten participants at a time enjoy a speed boat ride while waiting in the boat for their turn to fly. Parasailers sit

on the back platform of the boat, strapped into a harness. The parachute is filled with wind, then the winch is engaged, slowly releasing the line and lifting the flyers into the air. When the ride is complete, the winch brings the flyer to the boat where they land

ers back to the boat where they land gently standing up.

Widely perceived as a "daredevil" activity, parasailing is actually safe and fun for almost anyone. Our #1 priority is that you experience the thrill of a lifetime in a safe environment.

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



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

"Do You Know the History of Miniature Golf?"

The game of miniature golf began in the early 1900's as "Golf in Miniature," or a short game of regulation golf. The courses were built to emulate the regulation courses complete with a country-club atmosphere and lush greens. Some of the courses even had caddies! Miniature golf was one of the first sports to be played in the evening -- they were strategically built under lights of billboards or other areas lit brightly enough to allow evening play. It became "the thing to do" in the evenings after attending balls and galas. It was common to find these courses open until 4 AM.

With the Stock Market Crash of 1929, regulation miniature golf became too expensive for most people. In spite of this, the desire to play continued to flourish. And so began the game of "Rinkiedink" golf. Obstacle or hazard holes were developed through the use of anything that could be scavenged; wagon wheels, barrels, pipes, etc. Some of these "scavenger ideas" became so popular that they became the models for the obstacle-laden courses that we still see today. Miniature golf was very popular among movie stars and celebrities which helped to spawn new courses throughout the country. Tom Thumb Golf was the first trade name developed and patented for miniature golf. These courses were in demand nationwide and resulted in the "1930's Miniature Golf Gold Rush." Unbelievably, in the 1930's there were approximately 30,000 courses in the country with over 150 rooftop courses in New York City. It was a popular game in America - a leisurely game that could be enjoyed by any gender, at any age, without concern for athletic ability or handicap, much as it is enjoyed today.

During the 1980's, adventure-style course became popular with exotic names such as Montasia and Adventure Island. Many were built in tourist destinations. Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, became the miniature golf capitol of the world. The early 1990's, however, saw a downfall in the adventure themed course. This downfall is attributed to the fact that themed courses are patronized until the newness wears off.



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Island Camping

Island camping on Lake George, which is only accessible by boat, is known to be one of this region's most unique adventures.

Island campsites on Lake George are divided into three groups including: Glen, Long and Narrow - which are located in different areas of Lake George. Each of these groups have their own headquarters for reservations/registration (which is a requirement). All 387 shoreline campsites are located on 44 state owned islands in Lake George. Tents, motorized boats, fishing, hiking, and nature trail use are permitted. Each site is heavily wooded and private, allows at least one boat, and includes a picnic table, fireplace and toilet facility.

Cruiser sites (spaces for boats for day use only but with no sleeping quarters) are available in the Glen Island Group. Charcoal burners and privacy are provided for these sites.

Glen Island Group

170 campsites and 42 cruiser sites. Located in The Narrows of Lake George (not to be confused with the Narrow Island Group listed below) east of Bolton Landing. Launch from the Bolton area. (518) 644-9696.





We are so fortunate to be able to fish these pristine waters that are teeming with life and continually produce non-stop sport fishing action season after season. With our tremendous populations of hungry Lake Trout, acrobatic Landlocked Salmon and hard-fighting Smallmouth Bass, fishing enthusiasts frequently leave our spectacular lake with sore arms and big smiles! Like most of the charter skippers on Lake George, there is nothing we love more than sharing our passion for fishing with our customers and showing them a great time out in the wild. Captains around the lake try their best to provide clients with the ultimate light-tackle sport fishing experience designed for anglers of all skill levels. Book a fishing charter on Lake George and we bet you'll leave with long lasting memories "setting the hook" on one of the most beautiful lakes in the entire country.

Lake Trout and Landlocked Salmon, our "bread and butter" if you will, are two of the most highly sought after game fish in the lake. We pursue these species from ice-out to ice-up meaning basically all of the open water season from April to December. These species are targeted using light-tackle rods and finesse trolling programs in which downriggers, planer boards and other state of the art equipment work together to put fish on the end of your lines. We have seen incredible Lake Trout numbers over the past few years and an increase in the Landlocked Salmon population as well. Due to diligent stocking efforts and the introduction of a new "Sebago" strain of Salmon, we are finally starting to see a rebound in the salmon fishery which in past years has been struggling for reasons undetermined. We love chasing these majestic "silver ghosts of the open water" as they hit hard and can be very unpredictable once hooked. They will regularly challenge you by charging the boat or making numerous leaps out of water before making it to the landing net, if you're

lucky! Last year was one of our best years for Landlocked Salmon in a long time with many fish caught over five pounds and a few tremendous specimens boated in the eight to nine pound class. We are excited for the upcoming season and anticipate another banner year of salmon fishing.

Lake Trout fishing has been very consistent and there has been no shortage of action. We are seeing very healthy looking fish and have been marking large amounts of baitfish on our Lowrance fish finders regularly. These fish can be found all over the water column in the springtime and will tend to gravitate to deeper water during the peak summer months in search of cooler water temperatures. These fish are "eating machines" and generally provide clients with consistent action year-round. We love watching clientsand in particular children- hook-up with big Lakers! Catching these hard-fighting fish on light tackle is a one of a kind experience you'll never forget!

If you want lots of rod-bending action then you may want to check out our Smallmouth Bass fishing. During the peak months of July, August and September we search for large schools of hungry Bass which- at this time of yeartend to hang out on deep structure all over the lake. We typically will anchor over these fish and use light-action spinning gear providing all anglers aboard with a hands on experience. These trips are action-packed and usually produce some pretty big numbers of Bass and Perch, with even an occasional lake trout or Northern Pike in the mix. Pound for pound, the Smallmouth Bass is arguably one of the hardest fighting freshwater species and they are an absolute blast to catch on light-tackle!

We hope you consider hitting the water this year for a fishing adventure that is truly one of a kind. Being on the ginclear waters of Lake George, with a first-class view of the majestic Adirondack Mountains, is just what the doctor ordered to relax, unwind and spend some quality time with our loved ones. 
Lake George Region Geology

The glacial geology of the Lake George region has been influenced by millions of years of sculpturing and carving by ice and water. With extremely powerful forces of nature at work, great sheets of ice moved across the area acting as giant sheets of sandpaper. The rocks and boulders frozen in the base of the ice ground down mountains, gouged out valleys, and rounded both as the ice moved forward from north to south.

As the glaciers retreated, they melted more rapidly than when advancing, thereby, depositing enormous amounts of

water along with ground up rock and debris stored in the ice over its million year journey. Lakes such as Glen, Paradise, and Sunnyside were formed from broken-off chunks of a glacier deposited in low areas and melted. Other lakes, ponds, and swamps were formed from the ice disrupting the drainage of existing

Many glaciologists feel that we are presently in a warmer period of temperatures between glaciers, and that ice sheets will again cover the Lake George region and surrounding areas.






that the body of water commonly known as Lake George has an approximate area of 28,200 acres, an elevation of 322 feet, a maximum depth of over 200 feet, a length of 32 miles, a maximum width of almost 4 miles, about 44 square miles of surface area, almost 20% of its water from underground springs, and a surprising 8 years to exchange its volume of water. Since the lake flows south to north, the northern end in Ticonderoga becomes the LaChute River and gradually drops around 215 feet into Lake Champlain. Lake George also contains approximately 186 islands, 154 of which are state-owned with about 50 available for camping and some 30 plus that are privately owned.







Constructed in 1772 as a private residence for Patrick Smyth, the Old Fort House is one of the

oldest frame structures in Upstate New York and a

focal point of a 3-acre museum campus. Built with

house was used as headquarters for both British

and American generals in the Revolutionary War.

In July 1783, General George Washington and his

LAKE GEORGE VISITOR CENTER Beach Road & Canada Street (Route 9) • Lake George (Map E-4)



The \$1.4 million dollar Interpretative Center is located on Route 9 and Beach Road and replaces the Village's former public restrooms. The center hosts visitors to the Lake George resort area and contains several exhibits highlighting Warren County's variety of attractions as well as environmentally-themed interpretative elements showcasing the importance of the lake to the entire region. The 2,800 sq. ft. building contains a walk-up information center, a visitor information room, several regional displays including an exact scale model of the lake and historical exhibits from throughout the county. The outside deck overlooks the lake and Blais Park and leads to new public restrooms above an actual cascading mountain stream utilizing water drawn from the lake. Other features include an interactive display on stewardship of the lake sponsored by the Lake George Association and information on all Warren County towns and the City of Glens Falls in the "County Room." Adirondack Studios of Argyle has worked with the Village on the internal design of the building that has become another central attraction in the community.

GORE MOUNTAIN

Travel Tips

- Always carry several plastic clothespins and a night light. The clothespins are handy for many things, from clipping the motelroom window drapes together, to rinsing out some things and being able to hang them over the clothes bar or towel rack. As for the night light, motel rooms are usually very dark, so this light eliminates having to turn on a bright light when you have to get up during the night.
- Fold a damp washcloth over a few ice cubes and wrap in foil. If heat and grime make you uncomfortable while traveling during the day, use to freshen your face and hands

Joe started teaching school that fall and Judy started to work for a dentist. Their first big purchase as a married couple was a faceting machine to cut

Adirondack Garnets that they had collected over the years. Soon after, Judy took some classes to learn metal-smithing, and that was the beginning of a career in the jewelry business.

The Browns own Garnet Studio in North River. They share their love of gems with anyone that comes through the door. The Shop is a small boutique and a fun place to bring your girlfriends. Many a fashion show has taken place here. You can shop for that unique one-of-a-kind piece, or bring a group and learn to make earrings, necklaces or bracelets. If you are really adventuresome, Judy will take your group into her new cabochon cutting workshop and teach you how to cut a stone.

Joe facets mostly garnets, but they carry an amazing variety of other colored stones. A faceted stone is cut like

a diamond (with small flat facets on the top and bottom). The purpose is to get sparkle or flash. Each stone has angles that need to be used to get the best response from the gem that you are working with.

Judy cuts the cabochons with a flat bottom and a domed top. They are done freehand on a stick called a dop. Opals, Lapis and other opaque stones are usually cut this way. The cutting agent that is used in both faceting and cabbing is usually a diamond (there are about 3-4 different grits of diamond). The stones are then polished with diamond, aluminum oxide, or other polishes depending on the stone's requirement.

Come visit. It will be quite a learning experience!

Did You Know..

That Father Isaac Jogues, a Jesuit missionary from French Canada on a peace mission to the Mohawk lands to the south, was the first white person to see Lake George. Father Jogues made his discovery on the eve of the festival of Corpus Christi in 1646, and in honor of the day, christened the lake Lac du St. Sacrament or "Lake of the Blessed Sacrament." The English name of Lake George was given by General William Johnson in 1755 in honor to his majesty, King George The Second. A monument commemorating Father Jogues now stands in the Lake George Battleground Park at the southern end of the lake.





Warren County Bikeway

The northend of the I7-mile bicycle trail terminates in Lake George at Battlefield Park overlooking Lake George and the opposite end terminates in Fort Edward with views of a Hudson River yacht basin. The trail is a smooth pavement that is ideal for joggers, cyclists, walkers, and any other mode of non-octane use dotted with signage highlighting historical attrac-

tions with maps, photos, and paintings, all for the purpose of acknowledging and honoring the heritage of Warren County. Its varying terrain affords a most pleasant variety of scenery, wildflowers, small animals, and even deer on occasion. You'll get a fair share of uphill and downhill slopes, over bridges, through woods, and past streams and ponds.





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Lake George in History



Lake George was discovered in 1646 by Father Isaac Joques, a French Jesuit missionary, who christened it Lac du St. Sacrement and it was over a hundred years later when General William Johnson re-named it Lake George in honor of his king. By 1690, the seventy-year-long struggle between England and France for control of the all-important water route to Canada.

When the French built Fort St. Frederic at Crown Point in 1731, it posed a major threat to the British installations at Ticonderoga and this was the military objective of General William Johnson when he set forth from Albany in August of 1755. Johnson carved a Military Road from Fort Lyman, which he renamed Fort Edward, to the head of the lake at what is now Lake George Village. This road through the wilderness roughly parallels today's Route 4 from Fort Edward and Route 9 north to Lake George.

On hearing of Johnson's plan to attack Crown Point, French Commander-in-Chief Baron Dieskau marched south to meet the British head on. He reached the head of the lake on September 8, 1755. Here General Johnson, together with General Lyman and Mohawk Indian Chief King Hendrik, were encamped and the three conflicts which took place that day are known collectively as "The Battle of Lake George."

The first engagement took place when troops led by Colonel Ephraim Williams and King Hendrik's Indian forces headed north on the Military Road to meet Dieskau. A quarter mile north of today's intersection of Routes 9 and 149, the French were lying in ambush, and the British were well within the trap before the first shot was fired. King Hendrick died almost at once of a bayonet wound and, a short time later, Colonel Williams was shot and killed. His will provided for the founding of Williams College, and alumni of that famous Massachusetts school have erected a monument where he fell in a wooded ravine to the east of Route 9. Look for the highway marker and footpath leading to this memorial. On the west side of Route 9, a little further south, a simple gray rock inscribed "E. W. 1755" marks the final resting place of Colonel Williams. Colonel Johnson and King Hendrik were similarly honored with a statue at Lake George Battlefield Park, the original battleground which serves today as a 35-acre state park.

The Provincials beat a hasty retreat with Dieskau in pursuit, first to Bloody Pond and then on to the center of the barricade itself where the major battle of the day took place. Dieskau was taken prisoner and his wounds treated by Johnson's personal physician. When Johnson suffered a leg wound his command fell to General Lyman, and credit for the day's victory is his. Later, Captain McGinis with a replacement force from Fort Edward attacked some 300 of Dieskau's men at a stagnant pond along the Military Road. Legend has it that so many were slain in this encounter that the waters were stained red for weeks to come and thus the name Bloody Pond.

The winter of 1756-57 was a harsh one. Raids and counter-raids continued, and the French garrison at Ticonderoga was often under attack. The Rangers under Major Robert Rogers set fire to the outposts of the fort at one point, but


the control of the Carillon itself remained with the French. Meanwhile, General Johnson was building Fort William Henry at the head of the lake, a log and earth structure name for the Duke of Cumberland, King George III's brother. The fort successfully withstood a five-day siege by the French in march of 1757. However, history was less beneficial to the following August when the French under General Montcalm once again laid siege to the garrison in the wilderness. The fort's northwestern bastion was just about totally demolished and at last Colonel George Munro agreed to surrender, with the assurance of safe conduct back to Fort Edward for his men. But Montcalm's Indians defied their French leader and cruelly butchered and scalped not only soldiers, but their wives and children as well. Montcalm was helpless to prevent this infamous "Massacre of Fort William Henry" and his victory that day was a hollow one. The fort was destroyed and the logs, together with the bodies of the slaughtered, formed a giant funeral pyre to which the General set fire before heading north once more.

During the siege of Fort William Henry, the lives of Colonel Munro's two daughters were saved by the friendly Indians, Uncas and Hawkeye, who hid the girls in a cave under the Copper's Cave Bridge which spans the Hudson River between the city of Glens Falls and the village of South Glens Falls. This incident serves as background material for James Fenimore Cooper's classic tale, The Last of the Mohicans, and thus the hiding place is known as Cooper's Cave. A platform complete with interpretive signage provides for open viewing of the two tear drop cave openings. Fort William Henry, of course, has been completely restored and offers a unique insight into the days of Colonial warfare.

A short period of peace followed these French and Indian Wars but ill will was growing between the colonists and their Mother Country. In 1775, the American War for Independence got underway. Just a few weeks later the fort at Ticonderoga was seized "in the name of the great Jehovah and the Continental Congress" by Ethan Allen, Benedict Arnold and the Green Mountain Boys. The British under Burgoyne recaptured the fort at Ticonderoga two years later but this was the last military action there. On hearing of Burgoyne's defeat at Saratoga, General Powell burned Fort Ticonderoga to the ground and it was abandoned. Meanwhile, at Fort Edward, the infamous massacre of Jane McCrea became a rallying cry for the colonists throughout the countryside. When British General Burgoyne finally faced these men on September 19, 1777 at Bemis Heights, he was completely outnumbered. For three weeks he managed to hold the line, waiting for reinforcements which never came. The second "Battle of Saratoga" took place on October 7 and Burgoyne retreated to Schuylerville where he was not only outmanned but cut off from his supply line. Ten days later Burgoyne surrendered to General Horatio Gates, an event termed by historians everywhere as "the turning point of the American Revolution." It was deemed one of those "signal events which shape the destiny of nations" because France, from that time on, openly intervened on the side of the revolutionists. Without her assistance, the American bid for liberty may well have been in vain. The fighting continued for four years before the final victory at Yorktown, but the success at Saratoga strengthened a desperate people at a time when failure could have meant disaster. The Treaty of Paris was signed in 1783 and the thirteen original colonies were granted their independence from England. Lake George played a vital role in the ultimate creation of this United States of America.

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


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

With no escape, the waters from the two rivers rose and created the "Queen of American Lakes."

...that the body of water commonly known as Lake George has an approximate area of 28,200 acres, an elevation of 322 feet, a maximum depth of over 200 feet, a length of 32 miles, a maximum width of almost 4 miles, about 44 square miles of surface area, almost 20% of its water from underground springs, and a surprising 8 years to exchange its volume of water. Since the lake flows south to north, the northern end in Ticonderoga becomes the LaChute River and gradually drops around 215 feet into Lake Champlain.


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




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
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Hot Air Ballooning

Many visitors to the Lake George-Adiron-dack Region explore the area through various hiking trails and through beautiful scenic drives. There are some that have chosen to view the area in a different way. They've enjoyed a hot air balloon flight. A hot air balloon flight is one of the most amazing experiences that one can have. The panoramic view of the area below gives the passengers a "birds eye" view of the upstate New York Region.

Ballooning began in the 18th Century in France. Early uses of the balloon include using it for observation in the Civil War. Although the equipment used in ballooning has been modernized over the years, the concept has remained the same; and is one of the most unique experiences in the world of flight.

Everyone who takes a balloon flight will experience it differently. Although there are many shared thrills and emotions that are common to all, most people enjoy the tranquility of a flight while others find it exhilarating. The quietness of the flight is only interrupted by the sound of the burners.

The adventure begins when you meet the pilot and the crew. They will take you to the launch area, where the crew and pilot will prepare the balloon for inflation. After inflation, the pilot will instruct the passengers to get into the basket, and the flight will begin. The flight lasts approximately one hour. During the flight, the passengers will experience a 360 degree view of the area below. The balloon travels with the

wind, so the feeling is very smooth and peaceful. Throughout the flight, the chase crew remains in contact with the pilot, so upon landing the chase crew is there to greet the pilot and the passengers.


After landing, the pilot and crew will deflate and pack away the balloon. Most pilots will then have an "after flight celebration" that includes a champagne toast and a picnic with the crew and passengers.

One of the special things about a balloon flight is that it's a "hands on" activity for all. Some pilots will often invite and encourage the passengers to help the crew and become part of the whole experience. And because of the size of the basket (an average basket will hold 3-4 passengers), the experience is very intimate and personal. Flights are not recommended for persons with health concerns or women who are pregnant.

A hot air balloon flight is weather dependent. The weather has to be cooperative for the flight to occur. The winds should be light, and there should be no rain. Flights can be year round but occur more frequently between spring and fall. Just after sunrise and a few hours before sunset is the most ideal time that balloons can fly.

If you decide to plan a flight, plan for approximately a 3 hour excursion. Wear comfortable clothing and dress for the temperature of the day. You should also wear shoes suitable for walking in a country field. Because of the limited space in the basket, reservations are required.

Many people decide to take a flight after receiving a gift certificate, or seeing a balloon in flight, or even attending a balloon festival. Whatever the reason, it is definitely an experience that one will never forget.



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



The clothespins are handy for many things, from clipping the motelroom window drapes together, to rinsing out some things and being able to hang them over the clothes bar or towel rack. As for the night light, motel rooms are usually very dark, so this light eliminates having to turn on a bright light when you have to get up during the night.

- Fold a damp washcloth over a few ice cubes and wrap in foil. If heat and grime make you uncomfortable while traveling during the day, use to freshen your face and hands.
- Pack a family first-aid/medical kit. Checklist: alcohol wipes or antiseptic towelettes, adhesive bandages of different sizes, sterile pads, ointment or lotion for relief of insect stings and bites, anti-itch medication, tweezers, thermometer, gauze or cotton balls, small scissors, personal/prescription medicines, and carrying case.

Keep Your Children Safe When Playing Outdoors

Encouraging your children to play outdoors and keep their bodies active will provide them with countless physical and mental health benefits. Healthy lifelong skills can also be established when kids play outside. Some outdoor activities come with risk, however, and taking proper precautionary steps to keep your children safe is a smart thing to do. Luckilly, most injuries and accidents can be prevented with some guidance.

WATER SAFETY

Always supervise your children around water. If you can, enroll your children in a local learn-to-swim program to teach them proper water safety. Take precautionary steps for children who've recently become mobile: don't allow them to play alone near puddles and remove any buckets of water that might be around your house to stop leaks, undrained sinks/faucets.

OUTDOOR SAFETY

Apply bug spray to arms and legs (but never on your children's face) when spending time outdoors to prevent harmful insect bites or stings. If your child has a severe allergy, carry an epi-pen or asthma inhale. Apply SPF 30 or higher sunscreen 30 minutes before heading outdoors. Use a cold compress or calamine lotion to sooth sunburnt skin. Aloe Vera is a great option if you are looking for something more natural.

ON-THE-GO SAFETY

Always wear a seatbelt when riding in a vehicle. Teach your children to wear seat belts when being transported by other families and friends. Use car seats. All children under the age of four must ride in child safety seats; all children must ride in child restraint systems until their 8th birthday or until he or she reaches the top height or weight limit allowed by your car seat's manufacturer. The back seat is safer for children than the front seat. Ensure sports gear has been inspected to be safe. Wear helmets when biking or skating. The helmet should fit well (not too big and not too small) and be comfortably secured with a chin strap. Remind children to look both ways before crossing the street. Have them demonstrate to you how to do this to make sure they understand.

Growing children are impressionable and will follow examples set by parents and role models. This spring and summer, play safe!

North Creek and North River ADIRONDACK HISTORY!

The North Creek and North River area is rich in the history of the Adirondacks. And today, attractions have sprung up to enhance and enjoy this slice of time gone by. Probably the most famous incident in the area was when Teddy Roosevelt learned at the North Creek train station that he was to be sworn in as President of the United States after the death of President McKinnley on September 14, 1901. Visit the North Creek Station and take a ride on the Saratoga & North Creek Railway – just like Teddy Roosevelt.

Skiing History and North Creek are synonymous. The famous ski trains came to North Creek in the 1930's and 1940's and skiers enjoyed the "Ride up – Slide down" skiing of the time. Visit the North Creek Depot Museum to see exhibits telling the story of the history of snow trains and the development of skiing at Gore Mountain. Recreate the actual drive the ski trucks and busses took – bringing skiers up to Gore Mt. Today, the end of the road is The Garnet Mine Tour at the old Bar-

ton's Garnet Mine up Barton's Road in North River. Modern ski transport is the Gondola on Gore Mt. (operating daily July 7 – September 2) for scenic rides and great hiking destina-

While The Barton's Garnet Mine is the longest operating mine in the area, mine history goes further back to the Hooper Mine in North River near Garnet Hill Lodge. Take a short hike to the mine located on state land near Garnet Hill. Sample some other short scenic hikes to Balm of Gilead Mt and William Blake Pond, all perfect for families.

Not to be undone – the nearby Hudson River is rich in the early history of the Adirondacks. For over a hundred years, the loggers of the day used the river to float trees and pulpwood to the mills in nearby Glens Falls. With the advent of trucking in the 1950's, the log drives ended. But today, you can recreate the trip the river men took on the Upper Hudson River with a white-water rafting adventure. Summer scheduled dam releases are on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sundays. Numerous outfitters are located in the North River and North Creek area.







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
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
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
